The TAC is an important component of transportation planning for the Sioux Falls MPO. Working with the Citizens Advisory Committee and the Urbanized Development Commission (the MPO governing body), members of the TAC serve as technical staff for the formal transportation planning process. In addition, the TAC conducts official public hearings on all of the federally required products of the MPO planning process. The TAC meets seven times a year (every other month beginning in January) with an additional meeting in August. Meetings are held at the SECOG Center in Sioux Falls on Thursday afternoons and begin at 2:00 p.m.
